Walk in place and then sit down. Say: The king listened to Esther and protected God's people. God hears our prayers, too. God keeps us safe. Lead kids in a prayer, thanking God for keeping us safe.

God Keeps





As children play with dolls, talk about ways they can keep the dolls safe. Point out ways that families keep us safe: providing food, clothing, and a place to play and sleep. Review how God kept his people safe. Help children tuck the dolls safely into bed.



Prepare a simple construction paper crown for each child. Set out crayons and stickers and let children decorate their crowns. When they finish their crowns, place each child's crown on his or head. "Crown" the children by saying: Queen/King [name of child], God keeps you safe!

Block Play

Help children use blocks to build the king's palace. If you have toy people, let children use them to represent Queen Esther and the king. They can build one room for Esther and one for the king. Review how God kept Esther and her people safe when she asked the king for help. Tell kids that God keeps us safe, too.





Let children set up their own special feast with toy food and utensils. As they play, talk about what it might be like to have dinner at the king's palace. What kind of special food do they think the king might serve? Talk about how God used Esther to help keep her people safe.



You'll need the *Play-n-Worship* DVD, a DVD player, and a television. Play "God Is Our Help" and have kids follow the actions on-screen whenever a star appears. Play it a second time and use a rolled-up paper "scepter" (or a fancier one, if you like) to lead children as they sing along.
